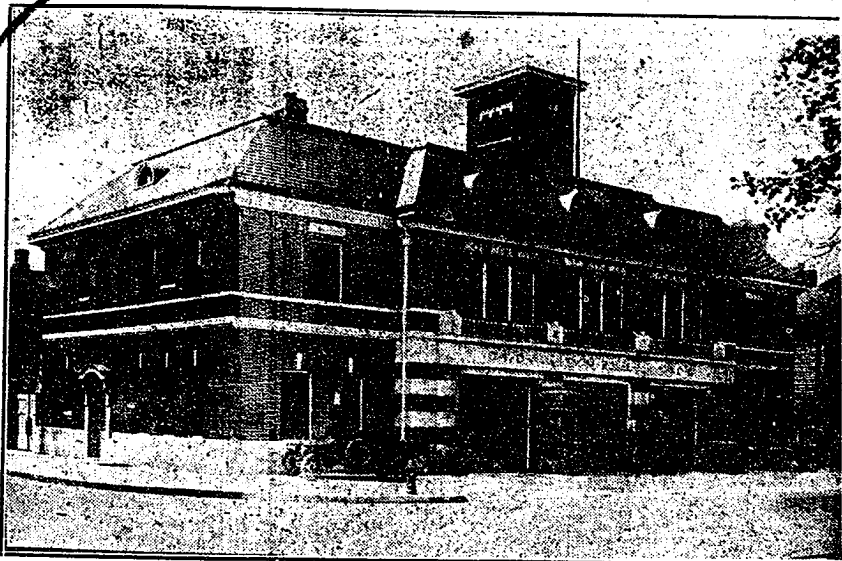


"CORKTOWN" FIRE FIGHTERS IN NEW HOME



Engine company No. 8, "Corktown's well-known fire-fighting organization, which has schooled some of the leading firemen in the Detroit department, slept, as much as firemen do, in its new quarters at Baker and Sixth streets Tuesday night. It moved into the new building, which is on the same spot where the old fire station was erected in 1872, Tuesday morning.

The company, under the command of Captain Alexander Thompson, has been house with Ladder company, No. 12, in Lafayette boulevard since the old home was razed a year ago and work on the new building started.

Captain Richard Filbin, who was killed in the D. M. Ferry fire years ago, was a member of Engine company No. 8. So were Assistant Chief
