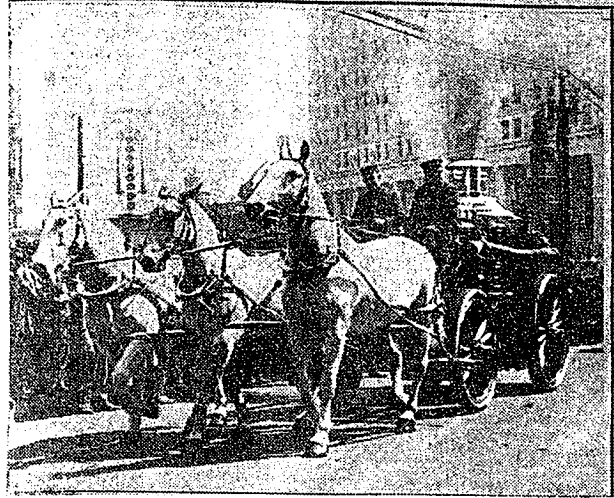
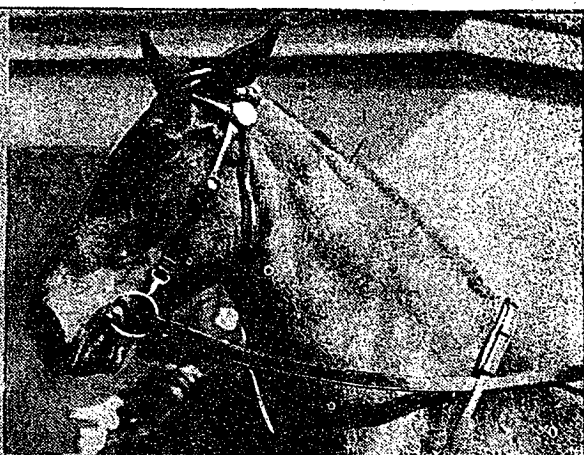

FOUR-FOOTED FIRE VETERANS BID DETROIT GOOD-BY



The picture in the upper row (left) shows the hose wagon driven by Superintendent of Horses Hugh Peters. Captain Alex. Thompson of engine company No. 3 is seated alongside of him. Behind them is the engine. "Ned," the oldest fire horse, who served 14 years in various companies of the department, is at the right. The lower picture (at the left) shows the three beautiful white horses that drew the engine. They will spend the remainder of their days on Belle Isle. At the right is the hose wagon and engine going up Woodward avenue on their way back to their quarters. The parade up Woodward avenue was led by the Detroit Fire Department band.
